### BRONCOS GET WIN NO. 8 AGAINST JAGUARS

The **Denver Broncos (8-8)** earned a 20-10 win against the **Jacksonville Jaguars (2-10)** to ensure a .500 or better record for an NFL-best 28th time in the club's 33 seasons under Owner **Pat Bowlen**.

Denver has more Super Bowl appearances (7) than losing seasons (6) during Mr. Bowlen's impressive tenure (1984-pres.) with the team.

### ROBY NETS SECOND PICK-SIX IN LAST FIVE GAMES

Broncos **CB Bradley Roby** gave Denver a 17-3 lead in the third quarter with a 51-yard interception return for a touchdown. The play marked his second pick-six of the season, as he became just the ninth Bronco with multiple interceptions returned for a touchdown in a single season. It also marked the fourth defensive touchdown for the Broncos in 2016.

### HARRIS JR. NOTCHES SECOND INT OF SEASON

Broncos **CB Chris Harris Jr.** recorded his second interception of the season in the second quarter to become just the fifth NFL cornerback to post multiple interceptions in each of the last five seasons.

## DIXON TOPS 500 YARDS PUNTING

Rookie **P Riley Dixon** punted 11 times for 506 yards (46.0 gross / 40.8 net) with three kicks downed inside the 20-yard line and a long of 58 yards. His 506 yards punting represent the fifth most in a single game in franchise history.
